Test Maximum will be = Test Target x2.5

11. (iv) Penalties Incorrect route taken = test maximum + time taken.

Scrutineering

12a : All competitors be aware that Motorsport UK have recently issued a new change to the 2-19 Blue Book regarding the use of tyres on rallies, as per below:

Tyres for **all** Rallies

3. For Rallies, all tyres used on the Public Highway must comply with the relevant Motor Vehicle Construction and Use Regulations, in **addition requirements specified in R18.4. (Road Rallies), R19.7. (Historic Road Rallies), R20.1.14 (Endurance Road Rallies), R.48.5 (Stage Rallies) and R49.10 (Historic Stage Rallies), and the following regulations. 3.1. It is the Competitor's responsibility to ensure that only moulded tyres are used at all times.**

3.1. At all times during an event the tread depth must not be less than 1.6mm over at least three quarters of the tread pattern.

3.1.1. Tyres marked 'For Racing Purposes Only' are prohibited on **all** Rallies

Tyres for Road Rallies.

3.2. For all Road, Navigation, Targa Road and Historic Road Rallies tyres are free subject to the following; a) tyres on the current FIA List of Asphalt Eligible Tyres are permitted; including sizes not homologated. b) Tyres on List 1B(from 2020) and List 1C are not permitted other than the Avon CR28, the Avon CR6ZZ and the Pirelli P7 Corsa Classic, for pre 1/10/90 registered cars, and the Yokohama AO21R (manufactured before 01/11/14); c) Tyres marked for "competition use" are not permitted with the exception of tyres on List 6 and 3.2a).

Start Venue – Pontrhydfendigaid pavilion

The trailer park, noise test, scrutineering and signing on will be held at the pavilion site in Pontrhydfendiagid. Postcode for the start venue is SY25 6BB. See the start venue map below for a diagram.

Seeding

Once published, the Organisers will not entertain ANY discussion into seeding. Contravention of this may lead to Exclusion for the associated competitors.

Fuel:

Competitors are reminded that there will not be a fuel halt on this event so you must ensure you have enough fuel in the tank to cover 65 miles. The closest petrol stations are Lampeter (open until 19:30hrs), Stags Head (until 18:00hrs), Aberystwyth (open 24hrs) and Ponterwyd (until 22:00hrs). So be sure that you also have enough fuel in towing vehicles and marshal cars.

Trailers

Competitors bringing their cars on trailer are advised there is a car park available, but this is on a basis of park at your own risk. This is situated inside the main car park. Please see the start venue map below.

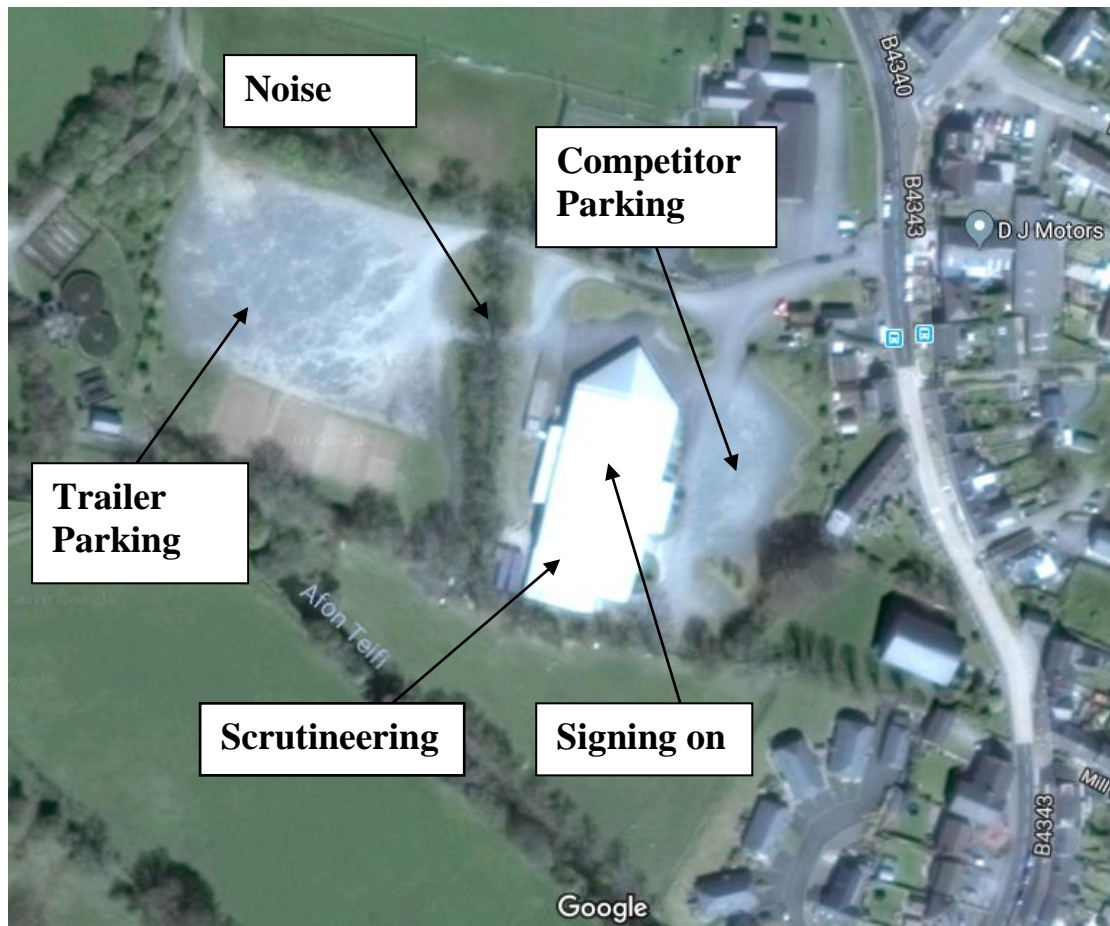
Noise test and Scrutineering:

Noise test and scrutineering will commence from 17:00hrs and close at_____. Remember to bring all documentation.

Signing on :

Sign on will be inside the pavilion and will commence at 17:00hrs and finish at 20:30hrs. Please be reminded all competitors and navigators must join Tregaron and District Motor Club to compete on this event. This can be applied for on the night at a cost of £10.00p.p If you require the event insurance and can not comply with JELF requirements please get in touch with the JELF themselves to acquire accepted letter to produce in signing on. Competitors are also reminded all monies outstanding must be paid in cash.

On arriving signing on please make sure your marshal has already signed on before moving on to MEMBERSHIP, MAP CHECK, INSURANCE then CLASS (S, E, N).



Section 170 Road Traffic Act 1988

DUTY OF DRIVER TO STOP, REPORT ACCIDENT AND GIVE INFORMATION OR DOCUMENTS

- 1) This section applies in a case where, owing to the presence of a mechanically propelled vehicle on a road, an accident occurs by which -
 - (a) personal injury is caused to a person other than the driver of that mechanically propelled vehicle, or
 - (b) damage is caused -
 - (i) to a vehicle other than that mechanically propelled vehicle or a trailer drawn by that mechanically propelled vehicle, or
 - (ii) to an animal other than an animal in or on that mechanically propelled vehicle or a trailer drawn by that mechanically propelled vehicle, or
 - (iii) to any other property constructed on, fixed to, growing in or otherwise forming part of the land on which the road in question is situated or land adjacent to such land
- (2) The driver of the mechanically propelled vehicle must stop and, if required to do so by any person having reasonable grounds for so requiring, give his name and address and also the name and address of the owner and the identification marks of the vehicle.
- (3) If for any reason the driver of the mechanically propelled vehicle does not give his

name and address under subsection (2) above, he must report the accident.

(4) A person who fails to comply with subsection (2) or (3) above is guilty of an offence.

(5) If, in a case where this section applies by virtue of subsection (1)(a) above, the driver of a motor vehicle does not at the time of the accident produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2) of this Act -

(a) to a constable, or

(b) to some person who, having reasonable grounds for so doing, has required him to produce it, the driver must report the accident and produce such a certificate or other evidence. This subsection does not apply to the driver of an invalid carriage.

(6) To comply with a duty under this section to report an accident or to produce such a certificate of insurance or security, or other evidence, as is mentioned in section 165(2)(a) of this Act, the driver -

(a) must do so at a police station or to a constable, and

(b) must do so as soon as is reasonably practicable and, in any case, within twenty-four hours of the occurrence of the accident

(7) A person who fails to comply with a duty under section (5) above is guilty of an offence, but he shall not be convicted by reason only of a failure to produce a certificate or other evidence if, within seven days after the occurrence of the accident, the certificate or other evidence is produced at a police station that was specified by him at the time when the accident was reported.

(8) In this section "animal" means horse, cattle, ass, mule, sheep, pig, goat or dog.

Rule 286 – Highway Code

If you are involved in a collision which causes damage or injury to any other person, vehicle, animal or property, you **MUST**

stop give your own and the vehicle owner's name and address, and the registration number of the vehicle, to

anyone having reasonable grounds for requiring them if you do not give your name and address at the time of the collision, report it to the police as soon as reasonably practicable, and in any case within 24 hours
